

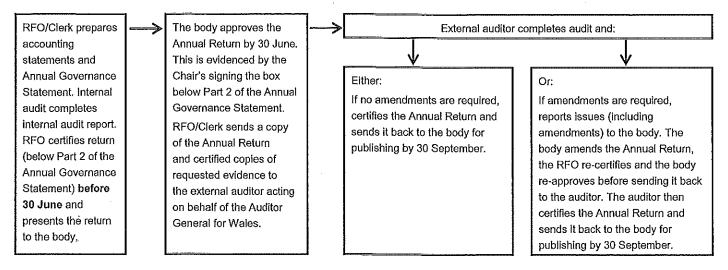

Audited and certified returns are sent back to the body for publication or display of the accounting statements, Annual Governance Statement and the Auditor General for Wales' certificate and report.

ISSUES ARISING REPORT FOR Broughton & Bretton Community Council Audit for the year ended 31 March 2017



Introduction

The following matters have been raised to draw items to the attention of Broughton & Bretton Community Council. These matters came to the attention of BDO LLP during the audit of the annual return for the year ended 31 March 2017.

The audit of the annual return may not disclose all shortcomings of the systems as some matters may not have come to the attention of the auditor. For this reason, the matters raised may not be the only ones that exist.

The matters listed below are explained in further detail on the page(s) that follow;

Clerk costs

The following issue(s) have been raised to assist the body. The body is recommended to take action on the following issue(s) to ensure that the body acts within its statutory and regulatory framework.

Clerk costs

What is the issue?

The annual return includes staff costs.

Why has this issue been raised?

The council has stated that they do not operate a payroll and are not registered as an employer. This is because there is a service level agreement (SLA) between the council and another council to provide the clerk and RFO services.

What do we recommend you do?

The council should consider if the costs paid under this SLA should be included in box 6 as they are paying for a service and not payroll costs. The council should also contact HMRC to ensure the SLA is valid in light of guidance issued in April 2011.
